**The Metropolitan Golf Club** is one of Australia's premier golf courses. The course was the host of the 2001 World Matchplay Championships-a tournament which saw the world's top golfers gather at Metropolitan for a unique matchplay event where the unlikely winner Steve Stricker walked away with a cool \$1 million pay cheque.

Situated in the beachside suburb of Cheltenham, **Victoria** offers a golfing experience on par with the world's best. The beautifully landscaped course is designed to challenge both the amateur and professional golfer. It is one of the region's tougher courses, with lightning-fast greens and some of the best bunkering in Australia.

**Royal Melbourne** - Designed by Dr Alister Mackenzie, Royal Melbourne West is Australia's most famous and Internationally acclaimed golf course. Home of the 1998, 2011 & 2019 President's Cup, Australia's premier golf course.

Alister MacKenzie's 1926 routing fits snugly into the contours of the rolling sandbelt land. His greens are miniature versions of the surrounding topography. His crisp bunkering, with vertical edges a foot or more tall, chew into fairways and putting surfaces. Most holes dogleg, so distance means nothing and angle into the pin is everything.



# DAY 5

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THURSDAY, APR 23

The **East Course** starts and finishes on the main site and is highlighted by seven 'home paddock' holes. The bunkering is superb while the greens, though smaller than the West's, are as beautifully constructed and sloped. It incorporates some of the most dramatic undulation on the course, the short four, long four, and mid four start is brilliant with clear risk and reward options from the tee and birdie to double bogey possibilities. The closing stretch starts with the short par 4 15th and the heavily bunkered 16th, which is the flattest 'home paddock' hole of either course but one of the best and most underrated par 3s in Melbourne. The final two holes are famously used on the world-renowned Composite Course.

The golf course at **Cape Wickham** has captured the attention of international golf critics and has already been ranked #3 course in Australian & #24 in the world rankings.

The golf course meanders through towering dunes and along the beach, where the roar of the ocean and a salty breeze embraces golfers, plotting their way around one of the world's most natural golf courses. One of the great features of the course is the variability in playing conditions depending on the time of day you are playing the course. The mornings tend to offer windless playing experiences with often crisp cloudless days whereas in the afternoon the wind tends to pick up and provides challenges on many of the closing holes.

**The Australian Golf Club** is one of Australia's most exclusive golf clubs.

The club was founded in 1882 with golf at the Kensington location not commencing until 1904. On that basis the club is arguably the oldest golf club in Australia.

A private member's course, The Australian has hosted a staggering 15 Australian Open championships which include the first ever Open in 1904 through to the centenary open in 2004

The golf courses was remodeled by Jack Nicklaus in the 1980's adding length, water hazards and distinct mounding to create a golf course dissimilar in many ways to the original. Most would agree that the modifications have made The Australian a better golf course. When played from the back tees The Australian can be a punishing course with long, exacting approach shots needed to tight, bunker laden greens.

Situated on the rugged cliffs at La Perouse, **New South Wales Golf Club** overlooks Botany Bay where Captain James Cook first sailed into Australia on the SS Endeavour in 1770. For golfers, however, it was the visit of another intrepid British pioneer, which gives the site its historical significance.

During his whirlwind 1926 Australian tour, legendary designer Dr Alister MacKenzie visited La Perouse and was enthused about the potential for building a great golf course. Clearly moved by the surroundings he declared that New South Wales (NSW) would 'present more spectacular views than any other golf course in the world, with the possible exception of Cypress Point'. Today golfers continue to make the pilgrimage to this sacred site to tackle a course built by nature, framed by the Pacific Ocean and shaped by the greatest hand of all.
